A 10-year-old Goleta boy, who was struck by a car on Storke Road Saturday after getting off a bus at Whittier Drive, was released from Goleta Valley Community Hospital this morning, a hospital spokeswoman said.

Chad Aaron Farrance, of 6930 Whittier Drive, suffered an apparent concussion and head lacerations when he ran into the path of a car, driven by a 23-year-old Goleta woman, at about 5:20 p.m., officers said.

The CHP also reported that a 16-year-old Santa Barbara youth suffered a broken collarbone when he fell off his motorcycle on East Camino Cielo, about five miles east of Highway 154.

Alan Douglas Dominguez, of 1200 Bel Air Drive, was treated at Cottage Hospital and released. He apparently lost control of the vehicle while driving around a curve, officers said.

In another accident, Herbert Bienczak, 23, of Santa Barbara, suffered minor injuries at 3:25 p.m. Sunday when his bicycle plunged over a 10-foot embankment at Arroyo Burro Beach and landed on a car at the beach parking lot, authorities said.

Lance Stephen Meehan, of 224 E. Victoria St., had been drinking from about 2 p.m. Saturday until 3 a.m. Sunday, the relatives told coroner's officers. He apparently died in his sleep at the Goleta residence, a spokesman said.
