Former Army chaplain to talk to Capps' class

The Rev. William Mahedy, former Augustinian monk and U.S. Army chaplain during the Vietnam War, will be guest speaker in Professor Walter Capps' UCSB class on the impact of the Vietnam war on Tuesday at 11 a.m.

Mahedy, who is currently the Episcopal chaplain at the University of California, San Diego, is the co-founder of the Vietnam Veterans' Outreach Program. His book, "Out of the Night," deals with post-traumatic stress disorders among Vietnam Veterans from both psychological and religious perspectives.

The class meets in Campbell Hall. Visitors are welcome, but seating is limited.
